## About the Survey

The Cornell Class of 2010 Senior Survey asks graduating seniors to evaluate Cornell and about what they learned, their experiences as a student, and their plans for the future.

The survey was administered via the web between March 30 and May 4. Of the 3,161 students invited to complete the survey, a total of 1,579 students responded, yielding a response rate of $50 \%$.
